He is the author of “Resampling Methods” (Birkhauser, 2001), “Permutation Tests” (Springer-Verlag, 2000), Applying Statistics in the Courtroom (CRC, 2001), and “Managers Guide to Design and Conduct of Clinical Trials” (Wiley, 2002). He is a former Calloway Professor of Computer Science at the University of Georgia, Division Head and Professor of Biology and Physics at West Coast University, and Associate Professor of Applied Mathematics at Claremont College. In 2001, he served as a traveling lecturer for the American Statistical Society.
