

IEA Behavioural Economics Network Call for Papers

The first **Irish Economic Association Behavioural Economics Network Workshop** will be hosted by the **Central Bank of Ireland** on **Thursday March 26th 2026**. The aims of the network are (i) to connect behavioural economists across Irish research institutions, (ii) facilitate new research collaborations, and (iii) explore cross-institutional funding opportunities. This one-day workshop will provide opportunities for both networking and dissemination of research.

The conference will be held **in person in the Central Bank of Ireland**, North Wall Quay Campus, Dublin 1. There will be no registration fee for the event. The conference programme will include a keynote lecture by Christina Gravert, University of Copenhagen, paper presentations, and a policy panel.

We invite submissions from researchers working on the island of Ireland to submit papers on any topic related to behavioural or experimental economics. We particularly welcome papers focusing on finance and climate/environmental policy. We encourage applications from PhD students, researchers with any level of experience across the public and private sectors, as well as policy paper submissions. Interested authors should **submit extended abstracts or full research papers** as a pdf file by **February 27th** by email to behaviouraleconomicsnetwork@gmail.com. Some funding is available for those without access to other travel funds for receipted travel to the workshop from within Ireland. Please indicate when submitting your paper if you would like to apply for travel funding.
